My first couple of meetings were there, then my family moved to Pennsylvania for a year, where I really dug into Al-Anon and attended at least two different home groups each week as well as a couple of open AA meetings a week. Delegate Report

Delegate Report for Newsletter – November 2024

I hope you are all as excited as I am about the new panel that will begin in January 2025. Let's all support each other as our Delegate Marcy heads to the World Service Conference (WSC) in April 2025, as a member of Panel 65.

A reminder about Chosen Agenda Items:

In planning for the 2025 World Service Conference (WSC or Conference), the Conference Leadership Team (CLT) agreed to:

- · Invite Conference members to submit up to two Chosen Agenda Items (CAI) beginning in September 2024 and ending February 17, 2025, which allows outgoing as well as incoming Delegates to submit topics.
- · Create a task force that includes the Conference Chairperson, Conference Co-Chairperson, and three Delegates to combine like/similar CAI topics.
- · Provide the voting results for all CAIs when announcing the two CAI topics that received the most votes.
- · Discuss two CAIs for 45 minutes each in the General Session.

Submitting CAI topics for discussion has been an important tradition of the Conference for many years. The purpose of the CAIs is to give all Conference

members (Delegates, members of the Board of Trustees and Executive Committee, and voting members of the WSO administrative Staff) an opportunity to submit and select topics and issues of concern that affect Al-Anon groups and members worldwide.

TOPIC CONSIDERATIONS:

As you think about topics, please consider whether the topic merits an in-depth discussion that could benefit Al-Anon groups and members worldwide.

TOPIC SUBMISSION CRITERIA:

The CLT is inviting all Conference members to submit one or two topics. Each CAI submission has a limit of 100 words. Name the CAI topic in 25 words or less. Provide the rationale, an explanation of why you think this CAI is important, in 75 words or less.

The deadline for our delegate to submit your topic(s) through the survey is Monday, February 17, 2025. Please consider and submit your ideas to Marcy as soon as possible so she can pick two to submit for Minnesota North. Notice that the deadline is before our spring assembly at which time Marcy will have received a full list from all areas and once again you will be asked to vote on the ones you feel are most important – and Marcy will submit them to the CLT.

HOW to reach Marcy with your submission? In the interest of anonymity, her contact information is not contained in this article – but please contact your District Representative for the contact information you need – I will make sure the districts have that information to forward to you.

It has been my honor to represent you as your delegate – it's an experience I will never forget! Your love has been felt all the way from here to Virginia Beach!

PUBLIC OUTREACH

Minnesota North Area Assembly Public Outreach Coordinator Peggy K. 2022-2024 Term End Report October 2024

Hello Al-Anon friends.

The old saying, time flies when you're having fun! I am so grateful and humbled by my experience as "Public Outreach Coordinator" for the last 3 years. The stories, memories, lessons learned, and insight gained is amazing.

My journey has been a busy one. As I say in all my letters, I would like to continue to state with sincere gratitude and a special thank you to Lois W. The Cofounder of Al-Al-Anon Family Group Inc. and the wife of Bill W. The Co-founder of Alcoholics Anonymous. Lois was a dedicated trusted servant representing the AlAnon Family Groups.

Purpose of Public Outreach is to share the message to those who suffer from alcoholism, provide information about Who Al-Anon is, what we do, where we are located and how we can reach out to our communities, areas and districts, Minnesota, and worldwide.

Throughout the last 3 years I have been busy attending groups across the district to talk about Public Outreach and support projects. The Assembly presentations were inspiring, educational, and wonderful. I was able to meet all of you, by Zoom or in person. WSO has been helpful in setting up billboards and answering questions, brainstorming, and supporting our Mn. North Area. I attend WSO sponsored zoom meetings monthly and quarterly which have been very helpful with great networking opportunities.

All the districts have been working hard to distribute literature and provide public outreach for their areas. They have been busy handing out packets, giving away books and literature at open meetings with their table displays. Printing stickers with groups meeting information to put on Help and Hope Pamphlets has been a big hit in the communities. Bookmarks with beautiful tassels, decorated beginner packets and pretty baskets at meetings helped generate enthusiasm. One Districts

distributed bookmarks with tassels at the Iron-Range-Get Together, it was very well received. QR Codes with links to groups and Mn North web page are very helpful and easy to use. They work as a wonderful resource for literature distribution and community outreach. Some districts were able to donate money from their budget to help new groups in their area with literature purchases to start a literature and outreach library. Drop off Public Outreach Literature and Alanon pamphlets at churches, libraries, treatments centers, mental health facilities, neighborhood small libraries, emergency services agencies, police stations, colleges, and schools. Contacting professionals in person at all agencies has been resourceful and helpful in developing contact lists. Group purchase of daily reader books to give away to newcomers at meetings has been a way to help the newcomer become familiar with conference approved literature and Al-Anon's purpose of sharing Step 12. Printing posters from WSO website (the green bottle posters, and new al-anon poster work well to reprint. Stickers with group location and QR codes are helpful for small communities. Some districts provided speakers to go to treatment centers and behavioral health/mental health centers on a quarterly or monthly basis. Billboard and poster projects "Not Everyone Trapped by Alcohol is an Alcoholic" was presented 2 times in 2023/2024. Active participation in Community Connect with a table of literature. Resources fair at a local college community provided an outreach project table presentation. One group contacted a Minnesota college to offer Al-Anon speakers to come to classrooms to present. Mental health center participation in community resource planning, outreach projects and literature distribution with monthly meetings and speakers. Distribution of literature to schools including meeting lists with location and contact information. Literature drop off in library boxes, St. John's College. St Ben's College. St. Cloud State University, and about 6 new churches in the district. Also left literature in Home Care agency and local clinics and food shelf. more clinics and food shelves.

I appreciate your service dedication, commitment, and endurance. We are all part of the group learning experience. Al-Anon has taught us to be patient, kind, and gentle with our members. We learn through cooperation, collaboration, and communication. Today we celebrate the opportunity to get together again as we know the worldwide fellowship of Al-Anon continues to be alive, growing again, and thriving. We are all trusted servants committed to helping our family members, friends, and community members who are affected by alcoholism.

At the recent March meeting of District 4, a motion was passed to spend up to \$150 for outreach materials for a new group which is starting in Glenwood Minnesota. Also, a discussion was started on a proposal to create a budget and create a position for an outreach person. District 004 rep will bring information to the June 9th meeting. District 005 No Public Outreach Coordinator at this time. Rachelle C. Contact District 006 Connie B. No new information at this time.

District 007 Laural I. The Public Outreach Coordinator All books have price in front cover. Pamphlets have been free or see price marked on them. Only one flyer per person and not for groups to take a pile for their groups since they should buy their own. I have our Round Up coming in November where I need literature for also. All I have is in the boxes. Report from Roland B. Laura has continued to put out Al-Anon literature at churches, treatment centers, libraries, and other public places. She has had Al-Anon literature tables at AA events with Al-Anon participation. One member of Al-Anon from our District gave a talk on Al-Anon at a treatment center this summer.

District 008 Julie B. No new information at this time.

District 009 Jan M.

February 2024: District 9 was contacted by Kiesler Wellness Center in Grand Rapids inquiring if we were interested in participating in a Community Resources meeting there. They seek to help providers and community members learn about support in our area that seeks to keep us safe and healthy. It is open to the public and they usually have between 20-40 people attend from all walks of life. Two of our members attended. This was a onetime outreach, though Kiesler House may contact us again in the future.

Literature Mailing: In early 2024, District 9 did a public outreach project distributing Al-Anon literature to schools, professionals, and libraries in District 9. Groups worked together in each category to order literature and send the mailings. The district approved each group to spend up to \$150 on their outreach project. May-June 2024: Hibbing Monday Night distributed over 100 "Just for Today" bookmarks that they added colorful silk tassels to. Distributed at Iron Range Get-Together and anywhere else members distributed. Very well received by recipients of the bookmarks.

- May 2024: District 9 distributed literature at the Iron Range Get-Together on May 3 and 4, 2024 at a table set up for distribution. Two to four Al-Anon members participated in this outreach.
- April-July 2024; ongoing: Partners in Recovery in Hibbing: District 9 is now doing outreach at this treatment center we are on a set schedule of every other month.

Several District 9 Al-Anon members did outreach at Partners in April and again in July and September. Outreach is to members in the treatment center. Question and Answer time at the end; and literature is distributed. Very well received. September 2024: 09/11/24: Resources Fair at the Good Life event held at MN North College in Grand Rapids; approximately 400-500 people attended (mostly students, but public could attend as well); literature distributed; two Al-Anon members sat at our Al-Anon table; inquiries made. Well, received. District 9 public outreach was contacted by a local recovery center, so this is good that "our" name is out there.

Community Connect in Grand Rapids: On 9/11, two members participated in this outreach event that is a community resources event for the community. A table was set up with Al-Anon literature; literature distributed, and any information provided as inquiries were made by attendees. September: An Al-Anon member reached out

to MN North College in Hibbing offering Al-Anon to come into their classrooms as we have in the past. No response from the college at this time. By: Jan M. District 9 Public Outreach Coordinator

District 010 Previous report information. Rozann B. District Representative reports there is no coordinator currently. She is recruiting.

District 011 Ann McK, and Ellie reported Since last spring Public Outreach for District 11 has accomplished the following: Dropped Forums, posters with QR code links to group schedules in our district, pamphlets, and schedules at 10 mental health facilities in St. Louis and Pine Counties. Dropped Forums, posters with QR code links to group schedules in our district, pamphlets, and schedules at 13 substance abuse treatment centers and identified a contact person in each treatment center. Provided Al-Anon speakers for Tagwii Recovery in Cloquet, CARE in Carlton, WebMed Recovery in Cloquet and WebMed Recovery in Duluth. Staffed a tabletop display for the first time at the Mino Bimaadiziwin Health Fair at Black Bear Casino with an excellent response from participants. Provided Forums, posters, and schedules to 3 area colleges, UMD, College of St. Scholastica, and UW-Superior. UMD requested electronic versions of the posters so that they could be accessed by students on the Student Health services website. Provided literature, pamphlets, etc. for an Al-Anon table at the Duluth Roundup in September. Dropped lit at 2 shelters, one for children and one for teens and young adults. Obtained contact names and numbers. Signed up for an Al-Anon booth at the upcoming HHS conference and set up 6 pairs of volunteers to man our table on October 9 and 10. Proposed a workshop at the conference focusing on 12 step groups in general called Hope and Long-Term Support in 12-Step Groups which will include sharing's from AA, Al-Anon, NA and OA. The workshop was accepted and will occur on October 10 from 10:30-noon. Secured approval for additional funding from our district for literature and posters. Used that money to replenish pamphlets purchased from the WSO and to print 75 posters on 9X5 cardstock for distribution. Maintained communication with the individual who expressed interest in taking over this volunteer work in January. Created an Excel file with all agencies, addresses, contact info and dates of interaction to help manage lots of details and then pass this info to the next volunteer. Of note, most treatment centers now do not focus primarily on the 12 steps. During the pandemic, many connections were lost, and treatment centers changed their focus and new ones cropped up. Some disappeared. Lots of change! This year was a year of reconnection and energizing folks in our Al-Anon groups to help with that process. Other than interacting with a parish nurse group, we did not connect directly with churches. Neither did we connect with the judicial system. I did not travel north past Duluth or south past Cloquet. We did not connect with the high schools. There is still a lot to do!

WSO In the Loop has been important in carrying the message of Al-Anon and keeping trusted sevenths informed. The new design of the website literature portal and other changes all contribute to positive image updates that help Al-Anon's image even more relevant in Public Outreach Activities.

Keep it Simple for Professionals, Institutions, and Public Information Media...uses the QR code as one simple tool to make it easier for the pic to find Al-Anon Information. Introducing these outreach codes to the districts helps public outreach in districts by putting them on printed materials, posters, and special event announcements. They can be easily downloaded and used in electronic communication to reach those who could refer their clients or patients to Al-Anon. Think beyond the box, beyond our outlined geographical areas, and consider regionally focused collaboration efforts. Public Outreach Toolkit helps to inspire

Public Outreach Projects. Please use the resource to share with WSO the projects you are working on in each area. Mediakit, News releases, Interview requests, resources for professionals, and membership surveys are helpful resources. The internet, web pages, and media resources are helpful at the current time. Billboards, electronic billboards, media ads, radio announcements.
